All of the parts of these Vocabulary Cards will be explained in more detail throughout this book.

Lexical Entry

This is how a Noun would appear in the Greek Lexicon. First comes the Nominative Singular form, then the Genitive ending, then the Greek Article to show the word's Gender. All other types of words, such as Verbs, have their own standard Lexical Entry form.

Strong's Number

James Strong assigned a number to each word in the Greek New Testament, and his numbers are used as a standard by Greek Grammarians.

Definition

These are the meanings of this Greek word. The definition which is **bolded** is the most common meaning used in the Greek New Testament. The words which are in *italics* are the most common synonyms used to translate this Greek word.

Part of Speech

The label for how this word commonly functions in a sentence.

Greek Inflection

Each Greek Noun falls into a category of inflections and each of these categories has a name. Verbs and other words have their own categories of inflection.

Noun

1. **A generic god or deity in the Greek sense.** • *idol, a god.*

Acts 14:11. And when the people saw what Paul had done, they lifted up their voices, saying in the speech of Lycaonia, The gods are come down to us in the likeness of men.

2. **The true God, Jehovah, the creator and sovereign of the universe.**

Acts 17:24. *God that made the world and all things therein*, seeing that he is Lord of heaven and earth, dwelleth not in temples made with hands;

3. **Spoken of kings as the representatives of God.** • *potentates.*

John 10:34. Jesus answered them, Is it not written in your law, I said, Ye are gods?

• *theist, theology*
